National News

An emergency doctor treating patients of the coronavirus pandemic said **several young people who had been hospitalised were getting "severely ill" despite having no underlying conditions:**

Glastonbury Festival 2020 cancelled as UK continues to battle coronavirus. "Clearly this was not a course of action we hoped to take for our 50th anniversary event, but following the new government

measures announced this week – and in times of such unprecedented uncertainty – this is now our only viable option.” ["The mammoth effort in setting up the event would prove impossible in the current climate"](#)

Heard about the pandemic? On ‘Big Brother,’ they hadn’t. Contestants on the German TV show have been secluded since February 10th. Producers had to break the news of the coronavirus to them: [A group of young people who knew nothing about the coronavirus pandemic](#)

Government offers £15m from Tampon Tax Fund to charities supporting women and girls. Charities supporting women and girls are being invited to apply for a share of £15m that is being offered through the Tampon Tax Fund: [The funding would need to benefit disadvantaged women and girls](#)

Leaders ‘unaware of care leavers living in tents’, finds Ofsted as it brands authority ‘inadequate’. Inspectors warn of 'dereliction of corporate parenting duties' and children being left in situations of chronic neglect after visit to Devon: ["Their corporate parents do not step in and act"](#)

Charities report 102 data breaches in the third quarter of 2019-20 to the Information Commissioner’s Office. The ICO recently published the latest figures, which show that it received 2,795 reports in total. This means that that charity sector made up 3.6 per cent of all reports: [Included "loss/theft of paperwork or data left in insecure location"](#)

Reports and Studies

Forget ‘digital natives’ – why inequality determines young people’s data literacy. A significant proportion of young people – often identified as “digital natives” – have the weakest understanding of how their data is harvested online and used, according to research by the University of Liverpool: [95% do not trust information they read offline](#)

How does alcohol marketing to young people affect underage drinking habits? Alcohol marketing to young people is more likely to encourage greater alcohol consumption, a recent study finds: [Owning alcohol-related merchandise had a higher impact on underage drinking habits](#)

Young Women's Unpaid Work Worth £140 Billion. The unpaid work of young women aged 18-30, such as cooking, cleaning and taking care of children, contributes at least £140 billion to the UK economy. By comparison, the financial services industry contributed £132 billion to the economy in 2018: [Their daily unpaid work meant they could not pursue their own career goals](#)

Health

Young people who vape are almost five times more likely to start smoking, research suggests. Young people who have tried e-cigarettes are nearly five times more likely to go on to try smoking, a review of the evidence suggests. However, it remains unclear whether or not e-cigarettes act as a ‘gateway’ to smoking: [Work is needed to understand people’s flavour preferences and reasons for vaping](#)

An increasing number of young people are feeling stress, shame and unhappiness about their body image and that this is being influenced by many factors including advertising and social media portraying the idea of stereotypical beauty and how this leads to success and happiness: [Stricter ads ‘could improve young people’s view of body image’](#)

Coronavirus: More children calling Childline about concerns. Since 21 January, Childline said it had delivered more than 300 counselling sessions to children and young people who had concerns about the virus. Nearly half of the total calls - had been made in the last week, between 9 and 15 March: [Childline said most of the calls -125 - came from 12-15 year olds](#)

Partnership funding deadline extended due to Coronavirus outbreak. As a result of the impact of the (COVID-19) outbreak the European Commission has announced an extension to the deadline for partnership funding applications. The deadline for applications is now **23 April 2020 (11am, UK time)**.

Erasmus+: under the Withdrawal Agreement negotiated with the EU, the UK will continue to participate fully in the current Erasmus+ and European Solidarity Corps (ESC) programmes. This means that projects successfully bid for will continue to receive EU funding for the full duration of the project, including those where funding runs beyond 2020 and the end of the transition period.
